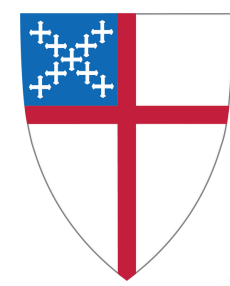
Lenten Dinners
