Veneration of the Cross



A ceremony that is said after the solemn collects during the Good Friday Liturgy. It is sometimes called Creeping to the Cross. Originally, it began as a veneration of the relics of the True Cross in Jerusalem sometime during the fourth century. We know this due to a journal written by Egeria, who is believed to have been a nun or abbess from Spain or Gaul. The prayers associated with the veneration of the Cross are believed to have originated sometime during the Carolingian era, 9th Century. The practice of Venerating the Cross began to wane during the reform movements of the Middle Ages. It was not until later liturgical reforms that the practice of venerating the Cross was rediscovered. It is important to note that the Veneration of the Cross has been a part of the Anglican tradition from the beginning.



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
