### A New Game

"I have said this to you so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution, but take courage: I have conquered the world!" -John 16:33

I am part of the first great video game generation. I remember as a youngster being absolutely enthralled in the arcade watching an older kid perform miraculous wonders of strategy and reaction time. My eyes were glued to the screen watching the evils of the world laid to waste by a progression of jump attacks from the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles. I remember standing in awe as I watched each successive level boss brought to waste by a pimply teenager with a joystick and three simple buttons.

Then came the day when video games made it to the home. I remember pulling out the game cartridge to The Legend of Zelda, which glistened with the color gold. I remember the hours playing that with my Dad. As time went on, I gained my own prowess. I became a master in Street Fighter II and MarioKart, and kids from my school would come to my house just to face me or watch others as we feasted on grilled cheese sandwiches and Crystal Pepsi.

These games revealed a lot about myself to me. They showed me perseverance or stubbornness, depending on your perspective. They gave me a community. It is hard to get adolescent boys to talk at all, so you go with what your friends care about. They also showed me that I have a lot of fight in me. They taught me to strive to the next level. I still remember the feeling of exhilaration that came the first time I defeated a whole game.

This propensity to fight is something that I think that our culture values. Not just video games, but action movies, and even how we tell the stories of history. We live in a fiercely competitive culture, and I know I have learned how to see the world through that lens.

But I can't help but wonder if those lessons don't misinform me a little when it comes to faith.

Like I said, I have a lot of fight in me. For most of my life I have thought that was a good thing. Maybe it is, but I am not exactly sure that it helps me with my spirituality.

I can't help but wonder how differently I would look at the world if I took that verse "take courage, I have conquered the world" more seriously. Jesus is saying that it is game over. The fight is over. If that is really true, I have to re-understand myself.

Re-understanding ourselves in the light of Christ's victory is what the season of Easter is about. What becomes of the soldier when the war is over? Easter is our re-entry. It is the time when we learn to let the fight go. That is surprisingly difficult when you think of yourself as a fighter. Trust takes so much more courage and discipline.

May God bless us all this Eastertide. May we learn to love playing the new game that God has given us. Something makes me think that it will be even more awesome.
