

REV. LES' RANDOM THOUGHTS

Sent Out

It seemed like a normal Sunday. I didn't even realize it was my last for a long while. I had graduated college not a month or two before, and I was back at St. Margaret's, the church that had raised me through so much. Later that week, I would be headed out for my first real-life post-collegiate adult adventure. I scored a position with this group called the Episcopal Urban Intern program. I would be living in a Christian community but in a brand new city, with brand new people, and a kind of work I had never imagined for myself.

Before the service began, the priest, Father Steve, a man who had known me since I was too young to hold the weight of the processional cross, said quickly but kindly, "Hey, you are leaving this week, right?" I had to think about it for a second. The following Thursday seemed like a millennium away and my packing procrastination was in full force. "I guess so...," I muttered self-consciously not knowing how he would know, much less remember. "Well, would it be alright if we prayed for you in the service?" I really had no idea what he meant by that. Was he asking my permission for the reader to say my name in the Prayers of the People? Or something else? In any case, I didn't know how to say no or even how to ask for more detail, so I gave a pathetic "...sure...?"

At the announcements, Father Steve called my name and asked me to come forward. I attended that church for most of my life, and I didn't remember anything like this ever happening before. I walked forward at a pace designed to

exactly split the difference between brisk and reverent.

I don't remember much of the prayer but I do remember Father Steve's long, strong fingers weaving about my head like a Roman crown of laurel. What Every person who comes through a church...is a missionary

little I do recall of his words was him naming me as a missionary of the congregation. I had never thought of the work I was going to do as mission work. I just thought about it as helping, and I certainly never thought of myself as elected or chosen from this congregation. It is funny we often think about choosing a church, but we rarely think of the church as choosing us even though that is what they always do.

In any case, I walked away bewildered. Moved for sure, touched literally and figuratively, but spiritually disoriented in the best kind of way.

I think of this often during graduation season. So often we think of it as leaving, but something

about that prayer and commissioning made me realize how opposite that is of the truth. In that moment, I was being reminded of all that I was taking with me from that place. All of the learning, relationships, and love wrapped in a bow of hope for me and faith that God will keep us tied together.

I love how often graduation season coincides with the story of Pentecost. Pentecost is a bewildering graduation. It is where the disciples aren't just given tools or experiences, but the very presence of God to lead, guide and care for them in this next chapter. These disciples were not primarily

leaving behind their experiences of Jesus but instead being anointed to take those experiences with them.

In the same way, we depart every Sunday, bewildered and equipped for the ministry ahead. What I didn't understand either on that graduation Sunday nor until I studied in seminary is that each and every person who comes through a church like Margaret's or Andrew's is a missionary. We all come broken and leave with a laurel wreath of blessing. I pray that each of us will know and feel that. Not just on graduation Sundays or on Pentecost but every Sunday as we go forth in the world rejoicing in the power of the Spirit. Because, as it turns out, that one Sunday was a normal Sunday after all.


