

New Year, New Horizons

It is 2026. It is hard to believe. The rush and wonders of the last year with you are so vivid in my mind that the time seems to have rushed like waves down a waterfall. I like New Year's and its invitation to reflect, to set goals, to start again and anew.

New Year's always brings me back. There is one New Year that always sticks out in my mind. It is not because of an oversized apple or a rocking eve it is because of a time of prayer. Back when I was still journeying toward the priesthood, I decided to make my way on New Year's Eve to St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral in Seattle, WA, for a prayer service. St. Mark's has a beautiful worship space, and the service was well-crafted, but that is not why I remember it. I remember I was thinking to myself, "Can I really do this priest thing? Can I stand at the altar?" while I was milling around in the back of the worship space. Without thinking, I leaned against one of the huge four pillars holding up the box-like cathedral. Then I happened to look up and I saw it.

The ceiling of St. Mark's resembles the bottom of a huge table. The four pillars, one of which I was leaning on, resemble four table legs. Immediately, the image of the outside of the cathedral came to my mind, and the cross that seemed to just be placed on the roof. Then click. I got it. The cathedral is designed to be like one huge altar.

I felt small but not in a bad way. I thought about how much I would have to grow to stand at that table. I should have felt scared by that, but I wasn't. I wanted it. I wanted my ministry to be that giant setting a building-sized altar.

Do you have anything like that? Something that both humbles you and calls you? Something you want to do or be a part of that feels huge? If so, I urge you to listen to it. Nurture it. Experiment with it.

Scripture tells us that with the power of Christ working in us, we can do more than we can ask or imagine. When we trust it, we will never be the same.

When I stand behind our altar with you every week, it is physically much smaller than the whole of St. Mark's Cathedral, but every time I come to our table, it feels just as big as the cathedral did when I was leaning against its leg. It is funny, but I don't feel small anymore. Nor do I feel like a giant. I guess I have just gotten used to feeling a part of something larger than myself. May you come to know that joy in 2026.



Discipleship: A Conversation with the Diocese Feb. 14th at 11am-12:30pm


We will pray, share a meal, get to know one another and explore a question at the heart of our collective ministry: What is a disciple? Please register on the app.
