In case of inclement or threatening weather, the Executive Team will decide early that Sunday morning to move the worship service inside for that Sunday and a post will be made on our Facebook page.

When we have drive-in worship on Sundays, we will need help in setting up, operating, and taking down the sound system as well as parking lot attendants. If this is something you are willing to do, contact the church office.
