When circumstances permit, the congregation may gather at a place from the church, so that all may go into the church in procession. The branches of palm or of other trees or shrubs to be carried in the procession may be distributed to the people before the service, or after the prayer of blessing.

Cantor or Celebrant

Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord:

People

Peace in heaven and glory in the high - est.

The following or some other suitable anthem is sung or said, the people standing.

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Here a Deacon or other person appointed reads the following

A Reading from St. Luke (19: 29-40)

When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, ‘Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, “Why are you untying it?” just say this: “The Lord needs it.”’ So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, ‘Why are you untying the colt?’ They said, ‘The Lord needs it.’ Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, ‘Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!’ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, ‘Teacher, order your disciples to stop.’ He answered, ‘I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.’

Palm Sunday Year C

Christ Jesus was obedient unto death on a cross, and exalted by God he continues to plead for all humankind. Let us join him in prayer for all our brothers and sisters, saying: Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Establish peace and friendship among all earth’s peoples; let violence and enmity give way to concord. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

We pray for the church...for Christians everywhere who carry their crosses and unite their sufferings with the Passion of Christ...Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

We pray for those who live in the shadow of the cross...for those whose suffering is severe...Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Heal the wounds that crime has inflicted on our cities, and help our judges and lawmakers to fashion a society based on trust and respect. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For justice and comfort among all who feel abandoned, especially the poorest and most marginalized ... remembering your mercy. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For the courage to embrace suffering for others in a culture that espouses comfort, self-promotion and excess ... remembering your mercy. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For those preparing to enter the church at Easter ... remembering your mercy. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For those for whom we have promised to pray...for those who most need our prayers...for those for whom we are concerned...for those we love, and for those we find difficult to love... Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For those who have died...for those who mourn the loss of a loved one...for those dying and for those tending to their care...Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Let us pause and remember that we are entering Holy Week and ask God for the grace to pray together as one... Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Lord Jesus Christ, you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the cross that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace. So clothe us in your Spirit that we, reaching forth our hands in love, may bring those who do not know you to the knowledge and love of you; for the honor of your Name. Father, we place our lives in your hands: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

The celebrant adds the concluding collect.

Father, the prayer of Christ brought forgiveness to those who crucified him, and the prayer of the thief brought him a place with Christ at your side. Hear the prayers we now make to you, and sustain your people in their need. We make our prayer through Christ, our crucified Lord. *Amen*
