As the disciples shared a meal with the risen Lord, so by your Holy Spirit bring us in faith to the table of the Lord where we may feast on him who is our priest and victim. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for all who are sick or suffering...for those who struggle with depression...for the men and women serving in our military... Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Bring us at last with all the saints... May all who have gone before, serve as examples as we continue our pilgrimage here on earth. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

O God, you manifest in your servants the signs of your presence: Send forth upon us the Spirit of love, that in companionship with one another your abounding grace may increase among us; Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

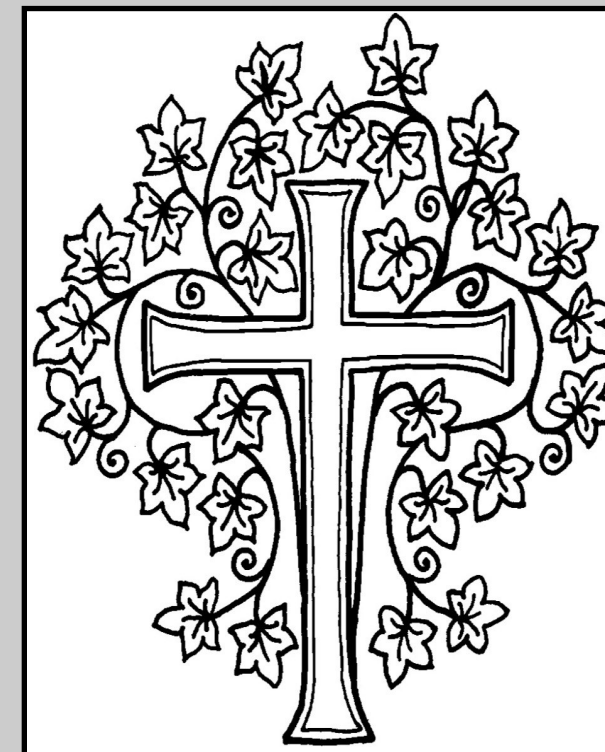
