Proper 22: Year C

For the leaders of the world...for our president, our senate and congress...for our local and state representatives...for the leaders of the Church... for all in authority...Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

For all whose lives are threatened...the poor...the hungry...the addicted...the sick...and those who have none to pray for them... Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

For those we criticize and scorn; may we over time become brothers and sisters. Grant us grace to make the first step toward reconciliation: Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

For those who have died...for all who are dying and are afraid to die... Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

That the community of St. Andrew's, along with the entire Christian Church, be united in peace, empowered by the Spirit, and faithful in its mission to all mankind, Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

O God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship, but narrow enough to shut out all envy, pride, and strife. Make this threshold smooth enough to be no stumbling block to children, or to straying feet, but rugged and strong enough to turn back the tempter's power. God, make the door of this house the gateway to your eternal kingdom. Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**

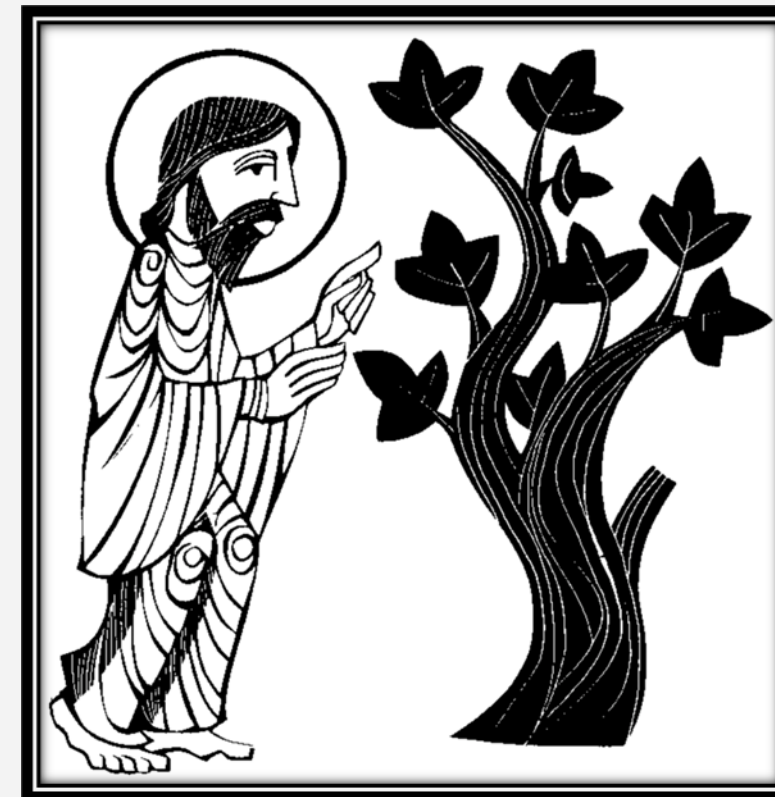
