O God, may the desire to follow Christ consume our whole being, and make our hearts and homes receptive to your call, with the same zeal with which Zacchaeus sought Jesus and responded to his presence. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

O God, we pray for all on our hearts and minds today; for our sick:....For our men and women serving in our Armed Forces:May they know you as the God of their salvation. By your grace preserve them in trouble and surround them with shouts of deliverance. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Going Deeper into God's Word

St. Luke contains some of Jesus' most beloved and most instructive parables. Through these unforgettable stories of seed, farmers, sheep and shepherds, lost coins and lost sons, waiting fathers, and good Samaritans, Jesus teaches us deep spiritual matters without talking directly about spiritual matters. In today's gospel, this outsider, this Samaritan, becomes, in his grateful response, a kind of "parable" for us. Sometimes Jesus speaks parables and sometimes he enacts parables. He preaches living parables, and instructs us by calling our attention to God's work among us through other people.
