Rejoice and be glad, their reward is great in heaven. And so we pray: We remember all who have witnessed to your love with their lives; give us strength to testify to Christ before the rulers of our own day. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For all who have died in the peace of Christ...**Lord, hear our prayer.**

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, make us worthy this day to serve our fellow man, who throughout this world live and die in poverty and hunger. Grant to them this day Lord through our hands, their daily bread and by our understanding love, grant them peace and joy. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

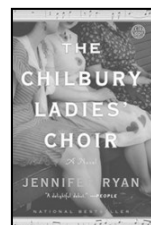

Every Sunday after services, we will be packing food bags for the students at Winstead Elementary.

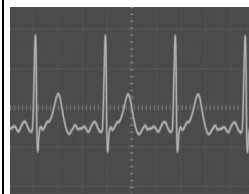
On February 19th, we will pack bags for the food pantry after the 10:30am service.
