#### Reflection is for Ascension Day. This year Ascension is May 18, 2023

Jesus' disciples, his best friends, are not known for their keen intellect. Lord knows they were mighty slow to catch on. As St. Matthew tells the story, they meet Jesus on a mountaintop. Mind you, this is after his resurrection; they know Jesus is more than just a wandering preacher from Galilee. When he appears, they worship him, but they continue to have doubts about him.

They are no wiser in the other gospel accounts either. For example, in The Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke writes that they ask Jesus if he will restore Israel's earthly power, even though Jesus has told them that this was not his mission. Jesus tells them to tell the world what they have seen and heard and then rises from their sight. There they stand, staring at the sky as he ascends into the heavens while a couple of angels scold them for their



inaction. "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven?" Acts 1:11

Before we laugh at the disciples and their response to Jesus' ascension, what would we do if we saw our Lord ascend? So often, we turn our eyes toward heaven, begging Jesus to do something and do it quickly. He gives us the same shrug that he gave apostles and says, "Why don't you do something? I have given you a share in my power and my glory. You are looking in the wrong place for me. Look within yourselves."

Of course, we don't feel very powerful or glorious. But whether we feel it or not, Jesus wants us to believe it. So did St. Paul.

In his letter to the Ephesians, he writes: "For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way." Ephesians 1:15-23

Notice St. Paul's prayer moves from God and Christ to the Ephesians and the church?

Jesus sends his followers out with nothing except instructions. As Barbara Brown Taylor writes: "Vocation is simply what you do, when you know who you are and who you are working for when you are sent out to proclaim the Kingdom and to act it out with no money, no shoes, not even a walking stick. Because when it comes down to being a provider of God's love, there is only one provider who sends us out with nothing yet with everything we need: healing, forgiveness, restoration, and resurrection. Those are the only things we really have to share with the world, which is just as well since they are the only things the world really needs."

We modern disciples may never realize how much we can do to build our portion of God's Kingdom but know this, Jesus is counting on us. Amen.

# **Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing**

Come Thou Fount of every blessing, Tune my heart to sing Thy grace, Streams of mercy, never ceasing, Call for songs of loudest praise. Teach me some melodious sonnet, Sung by flaming tongues above. Praise the mount! I'm fixed upon it, Mount of God's redeeming love. Here I find my greatest treasure, Hither by Thy help I come. And I hope by Thy good pleasure, Safely to arrive at home. Jesus sought me when a stranger, Wand'ring from the fold of God; He to rescue me from danger, Bought me with His precious blood. O, to grace how great a debtor, Daily I'm constrained to be! Let Thy goodness like a fetter, Bind my wand'ring heart to thee; Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, Prone to leave the God I love. Here's my heart, O take and seal it. Seal it for Thy courts above.

Robert Robinson (1735-1790) was 16 years old and running with the wrong crowd when he went by chance to hear the celebrated 37-year-old evangelist, George Whitefield, preach in London on May 24, 1752. Three and a half years later, in December 1755, Robinson became a Christian and "found full and free forgiveness through the precious blood of Jesus Christ."
He soon began preaching for Methodist and Baptist churches in the area around Norwich and Cambridge. In May 1758, when he was only 22 years old, Robinson penned "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" for his sermon on Pentecost Sunday. In the following year of 1759, the lyrics of this powerful hymn were included in a small hymnal entitled A Collection of Hymns Used by the Church of Christ in Angel Alley Bishopsgate.
