Empower with your Spirit, O Lord, all the sick and dying...for those awaiting results of tests...for those undergoing treatment for a life threatening illness...for those struggling with pain or weariness... we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Empower with your Spirit, O Lord, the newly baptized, that they may never cease to praise you for the hope that fills their hearts... we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Empower with your Spirit, O Lord, those who mourn the loss of a loved one... may all the departed rest in peace... we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Empower with your Spirit, O Lord, our soldiers. Support them in the day of battle, and in the time of peace keep them safe from all evil; give them courage and loyalty; grant that in all things they serve without reproach... we pray: Lord, hear our prayer.

O God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship, but narrow enough to shut out all envy, pride, and strife. Make this threshold smooth enough to be no stumbling block to children, or to straying feet, but rugged and strong enough to turn back the tempter's power. God, make the door of this house the gateway to your eternal kingdom, we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Gracious God, it is in the power of your abundant and life-giving Spirit that we call upon you in prayer. Deepen our hope in your presence and your promise; hear us in your tender love, now and forever. Amen.
