That, like the apostles, all the people in the church may live their faith and labor in love for the poor, the homeless, the imprisoned, the persecuted, and the sick, and that by God's power, the suffering of all may be relieved, let us pray to the one who is Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

For all who are sick or in need...for those awaiting test results...and for those seeking spiritual guidance...let us pray to the one who is Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

For all who have died...for those who mourn...may they, through the mercy of God, know the healing power of his love; let us pray to the one who is Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

Almighty and eternal God, those who take refuge in you will be glad and will forever shout for joy. Protect our soldiers as they go about their duties. Protect them with the shield of your strength and keep them safe from evil and harm. May the power of your love enable them to return home in safety, that with all who love them, they may ever praise you for your loving care...Let us pray to the one who is Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

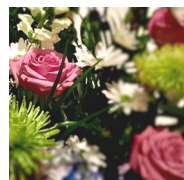

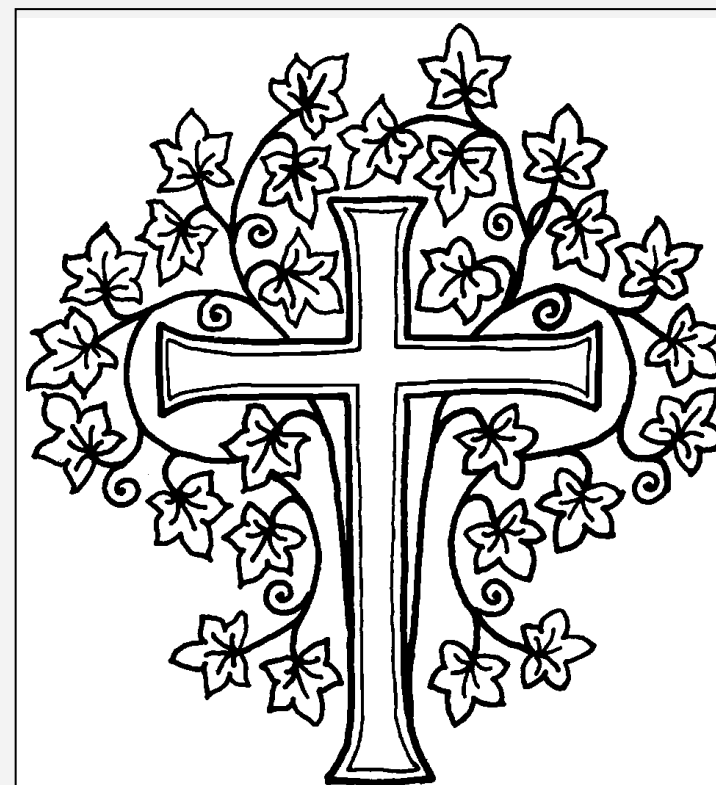
