Going Deeper Into God's Word

In his last days, former Pres. Harry S Truman would take a morning walk every day, often with his friend Thomas Melton, pastor of a local church. Their path would take them past a large ginkgo, one of the most beautiful and impressive trees in town. Truman would routinely walk over to the tree and speak to it. Years later, after Truman's death, someone asked Milton what Truman said to the tree. "He would say, 'you're doing a good job."

"You're doing a good job" was, in its own way, Truman's hymn of praise to the creation. Truman was using something of the same discernment and expressing something of the same praise for the creator and the creation that he was accustomed to singing and praying on Sunday mornings, the words of worship flowing out into faithful witness in life. 
