Ever-loving God, whose will it is that all should come to the knowledge of your Son Jesus Christ, and the power of his forgiveness, and the hope of his resurrection: Grant that in our witness to him we may make worthy use of the means you have given us; and prosper our efforts to share this glad news throughout the world. Lord, in your mercy. **Hear our prayer.**
