Epiphany V Year B

Jesus went through Galilee preaching and healing and showing compassion to those in need. As God comes no less today to those for whom we pray, let us offer our prayers to God, saying: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Lord of the church, gather us all into one holy communion. Give us the wisdom to see you as our source of unity. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Great Physician, bring healing to all who suffer in body, mind, or spirit. We pray for those we know and love...and for those known only to you...Inspire us to care for your gifts of healthy bodies and minds. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Spirit of the living Christ, fill us with expectation and eager longing for the coming of that day when no one will suffer, but when all will be gathered together in heavenly joy and eternal prosperity. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for those who have died in the hope of the resurrection...and for those who mourn their loss...Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

In this season of Epiphany, let us pray for each other as we struggle with the darkness in our lives. Let us pray for God's grace as we seek the face of Christ in ourselves and in our neighbors. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

Most gracious and loving God: Strengthen the hearts of your people in this diocese that loving you with our whole heart, and loving our neighbors as ourselves, we might, in the power of the Spirit, obey the call of Jesus, to go into our world as disciples making disciples, and making a difference. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

O God, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship, but narrow enough to shut out all envy, pride, and strife. Make this threshold smooth enough to be no stumbling block to children, or to straying feet, but rugged and strong enough to turn back the tempter's power. God, make the door of this house the gateway to your eternal kingdom. Lord, in your mercy: **Hear our prayer.**

The celebrant adds the concluding collect.

All this we ask, O God, in the name of Christ, who died and rose for us, and whose coming in glory we await. Accept our prayers and praises, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

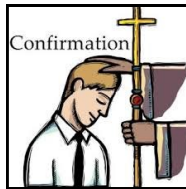
