



The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday March 24, 2024

When circumstances permit, the congregation may gather at a place from the church, so that all may go into the church in procession. The branches of palm or of other trees or shrubs to be carried in the procession may be distributed to the people before the service, or after the prayer of blessing.



The following or some other suitable anthem is sung or said, the people standing.

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

A Reading from St. Mark (11:1-11a)

When they were approaching Jerusalem at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.



Palm Sunday Year B

Our Lord comes to us humbly, riding a donkey and proclaiming a message of peace. Let us pray, saying: Lord, hear our prayer.

Let us pray for those who live in the shadow of the cross: For our sick and suffering...For those who must witness the suffering of someone they love...For those living with depression, addiction, chronic pain...For all who find themselves in the midst of a personal crises...we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

We give thanks for all the departed who had the mind of Christ and were humble servants of God...for ourselves, that we may be obedient even unto death...we pray: Lord, hear our prayer.

Lord Jesus Christ, you stretched out your arms of love on to the hard wood of the cross so that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace. So clothe us in your Spirit, that we, reaching forth our hands in love, may bring those who do not know you to the knowledge and love of you, for the honor of your name, we pray: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Let us pray quietly for all that we need to be the holy men and women God calls us to be, ...we pray: Lord, hear our prayer.


The celebrant adds the concluding collect.



The Procession:




During the procession into the Nave, we will receive our palm branches from members of the altar guild while singing the following hymn:




