Christ our cornerstone intercedes for us before God. Let us, and all in authority, heed God's call for justice in the church, in our community, and in the nation. For this, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.** 

That we see God as the Giver of every gift, including the most precious and holy gift of His Son, Jesus Christ, and that God will lead us to be a generous giver of gifts, enabling us to carry out Christ's mission for His Church on earth. Today, we pray for our children at St. Andrews; the preschool and kindergarten, and for the migrant workers seeking refuge through the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry in Newton Grove. For this, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.** 

We are saved by a God who is light, in whom there is no darkness at all. Let us beg for God's light in those places that seem darkest. We pray for all who have died....May they be at rest in Christ, and may those who mourn, know the healing power of your love. For this, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.** 

O God, you have made of one blood all the peoples of the earth, and sent your blessed Son to preach peace to those who are far off and to those who are near: Grant that people everywhere may seek after you and find you; bring the nations into your fold; pour out your Spirit upon all flesh; and hasten the coming of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. For this, let us pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**
